Students will research what worry dolls are?
What medium they are made with,.

Students will investigate alternative ways to join materials together and various stitches, (running stitch and back stitch)

Students will explore and investigate the materials used for the project.

Student will need to create a material board



Make

Students will use a template in order to mark out the shape of the doll.

Students will use a stencil in order to mark out the repeated shapes on their mask.

Students will cut out the shapes out of fabric

Students will use stitches to join two materials together



Evaluate

Students will explain what they like and don't like in worry doll

Students will evaluate the design ideas of their peers, explaining the strengths and areas that could be improved.

Students will evaluate their final design idea by comparing it to other glove puppets, to see what key elements they have.

Students will explain what is good about their work and what could be improved.

Students will sketch an improved design idea based upon their evaluation.

Students will study the history of African masks and explain the key features.

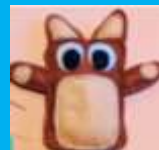
Students will produce a mind map explaining all of the key features that are often found in African masks.

Key Vocabulary

Textile - any cloth or goods produced by weaving, knitting, or felting.

Knot - a fastening made by looping a piece of string,

Running stitch - a simple needlework stitch consisting of a line of small even stitches

Needle - a piece of polished metal with a point at one end and a hole or eye for thread

Thread - a long, thin strand of cotton, nylon, or other fibres used in sewing

Fibre - a thread or filament from which a vegetable tissue, mineral substance, or textile is formed

Tie off - To close, seal, or end something by tying a knot.

Famous Designers

Vivienne Westwood
Fashion Designer

She was a primary school teacher before becoming a famous designer.

In the 1960's, alongside her husband Malcolm McLaren, she designed clothes with a rock 'n' roll influence which was very shocking to people at the time.

In 2004, an exhibition devoted to her costumes opened at the Victoria and Albert Museum in London. This was the largest exhibition the museum had ever dedicated to a British designer.

Westwood has twice been awarded British Designer of the Year and became a Dame in 2008.
